This programme was developed by clinical psychologist Prof Matt Sanders at the University of Queensland, with more than 40 years of ongoing research. As an added incentive, this run is **specially catered for parents of Primary 1 students.** This is to enable our speakers to also address transition issues which most parents commonly face. Parents are also provided the opportunity to discuss on other development concerns of your children for this particular age group during the Q & A segment. Sign-ups are limited to the first 50 parents/couples for each school and will be on first-come first-served basis. 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6	Lightening of Students' School Bag I would like to share with Parents and Guardians what the school is doing to help Student manage the weight of their school bags.							
	 Measures undertaken are as follows: Form teachers explain the timetable to Students. The teachers will also brief Students on the books to bring on a daily basis until they are familiar with the timetable. Students will be informed ahead of time should there be a need by the teachers to swap teaching periods so students can continue to bring the necessary learning resources (eg Textbooks, colouring materials etc) to school. Heavier items such as dictionaries, workbooks and files may be collected and stored in the classrooms. 							
	 What Parents can do: Select bags of lightweight material with few compartments and straps that are adjustable and cushioned. Have your children carry personal items in a separate bag to distribute the load Advise your children to pack according to the timetable pack loose worksheets into a file. It is not necessary for the children to bring the different subject files on a daily basis. check that only relevant materials are brought (eg Workbook A or B, not both) avoid bringing unnecessary items to school eg 1 storybook, not several fill small water bottles in school (unless students have health concerns). Trolley Bags Trolley bags are comparatively heavier than normal haversacks. Students using trolley bags are required to carry the bags when they go up and down the staircase. We have witnessed several instances where students have tripped over trolley bags dragged by their peers. In view of these concerns, the use of trolley bags is discouraged. 							
7	 School's Homework Policy There are 3 broad categories of homework that Teachers may assign to students. These are: Practice Exercises which aim to help students to reinforce, recall and practise newly acquired skills or concepts Preparatory Homework which requires students to source for and read background information to prepare them for future lessons on a specific topic or subject. Extension Homework which encourages students to pursue knowledge individually and imaginatively. It may include writing a book review, painting a picture, doing a research, or retrieving information from the internet. When assigning homework, Teachers in Fern Green Primary School adhere to the following principles: Homework that is assigned must be regular (not necessarily daily) Homework that is set should be appropriate for the students' age and ability Homework set should be challenging and purposeful, but not so demanding that it has adverse effects on the students' motivation Homework assignment needs to take into account students' other commitments such as involvement in CCA and afternoon classes 	ST1 and ST3

Please note that time for learning of Spelling and Dictation has not been factored into the duration as students are provided with spelling lists for early preparation.

To protect family time, minimal homework will be assigned during School and Public Holidays.

Helping your child manage Homework Load

Parents/Guardians can help by taking an active interest in the work given to your child, and encourage and support your child with praises when he/she completes his /her work. A conducive place which is quiet and well lit should be provided for him / her to study and do his / her homework. It is important to set aside time for your child to complete his / her homework.

Finally, I would like to urge Parents/Guardians to give priority to your child's completion of school-assigned work and refrain from assigning additional work should the load on any particular day be heavy. Teachers on their part will exercise flexibility in terms of deadlines for submission of homework assigned to students on long school days (such as on days when CCA is conducted) as well as when students return from medical leave.
