	Students offered HMTL at P3 should <u>be proficient in their oracy skills</u> and <u>demonstrate</u>				
	strong foundation for literary skills. Selected students must fulfil the basic selection				
	criteria that include:

	Curriculum Structure Selected students are required to attend an additional one hour lesson weekly after school hours on one of the weekdays scheduled by the school. Assessment			
	HMTL at P3 will be reflected as a non-weighted assessment. Non-weighted assessment refers to assessments where the scores will not form part of the computation of a student's overall results in a subject for the year. P3 HMTL students will still sit for the End-Of Year Examination like all other non- HMT students. The schools would also indicate students' progress in HMTL in the Holistic Development Profile. Students not selected for HMTL programme at P3 could still be offer HMTL at P5 when he/she builds stronger proficiency and interest.
