#### 2 Resumption of Face-to-Face CCA (or CCA on-site)

We will be resuming face-to-face CCAs from Term 2 Week 1 (Week beginning 21 Mar 2022).

In order to safely resume our CCAs with proper Safe Management Measures in place, CCA groups with high enrolment will be divided into groups A and B. Each group will take turns to participate in CCA on-ste in alternate weeks. The other group will attend e-CCA at home. CCAs with small enrolment will not be divided into two groups and members will attend CCA on-site weekly.

Respective CCA teachers would have informed the students which group they are in and when they are having CCA on-site.

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# No Item 4 ADVISORY TO SCHOOLS ON DENGUE SITUATION AND DENGUE CONTROL MEASURES

In the first three months of 2022, Singapore has had over 1,900 dengue cases. The weekly number of reported dengue cases has climbed steadily since January, with a sharp jump to 372 cases in the second week of March.

The National Environment Agency (NEA) has observed that dengue virus serotype 3 (DENV-3) makes up the highest proportion of positive dengue samples serotyped in February 2022. The rise in proportion of DENV-3 cases is of concern, as we have not had dengue outbreaks driven by DENV-3 in Singapore for almost three decades. This means that our population has lower immunity to DENV-3 and consequently, a large proportion of our population is susceptible to DENV-3 infections. This, taken together with many areas in Singapore registering high adult Aedes aegypti population in the community, where a sizeable proportion of people are still staying in and working from home, providing blood meals to the day-biting Aedes aegypti mosquito, increases the probability of dengue transmission and formation of dengue clusters.

Keeping the mosquito population in check is key to minimising dengue transmission and requires the joint efforts of every individual and stakeholder in the community to eradicate mosquito breeding habitats. NEA will deploy new alert banners ('louder' purple banners) at areas with persistently high *Aedes aegypti* mosquito population. These areas form a subset of locations with higher *Aedes aegypti* mosquito population, which NEA currently updates monthly on its website. The intent is to alert residents, community partners, and key stakeholders at such areas to take preventive measures against mosquito breeding, in order to reduce the risk of dengue. NEA will also launch the National Dengue Prevention Campaign on 30 March 2022 to rally the public to practise the **Mozzie Wipeout B-L-O-C-K steps** to prevent mosquito breeding and do the **S-A-W actions** to protect themselves from mosquito bites.

Let us all practise the "Mozzie Wipe-out" both at home and in school, so that we can keep everyone safe in the community. Students and staff showing symptoms suggestive of dengue should see their GPs early to be diagnosed.
