	2. <u>Parenting Resource on Supporting Children in Coping with Anxiety</u>		
	As students will be sitting for their end-of-year assessments this term, they are likely to feel more anxious and may display behavioural changes, such as being more easily distracted and not being able to sleep well. This period of time can also make many parents feel stressed and anxious, as they grapple with becoming a support for their children.

It could help parents develop a better understanding of the anxiety and gain practical ideas on how they can become a support for their children during this period of time.
