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2. School-Based Class Tests

Building on efforts to nurture life-long learning and to move away from an over-emphasis on academic results and perceived examination stakes, Ministry of Education (MOE) has been adjusting school-based assessment structures at the Primary and Secondary levels from 2019. One key initiative is the removal of mid-year examinations for all primary and secondary schools in 2023. Instead, weighted assessments (WA) will be conducted to identify what students have mastered and the areas they have difficulties in. Schools are advised to make use of school-based assessment primarily to support the learning process, rather than be preoccupied with issues of standardisation and comparability. Schools should not conduct WA in a manner that simulates examination conditions as school-based assessment is generally not high-stake.

At Fern Green Primary School, we have spread out the class tests over a period of two weeks to ensure that our students will not be overloaded with too many tests in a particular week. Thus, the students will only sit for two class tests in a week. The class tests also assess fewer topics, which will be more manageable for the students. It will be conducted as part of the daily classroom lessons and according to their timetables.

Students and parents will be informed semestrally of the weeks that the class tests will be conducted. Students will also be informed of the specific dates of the class tests at the respective levels they are in a week before the dates of the class tests. The dates of the respective class tests will then be reflected in the school calendar.

We hope to have parents' support in enacting these changes in school-based assessments to reinforce our commitment to nurture the whole child and shift practices from an over-emphasis on academic results to focus on learning for mastery and for life.

3. Walk-In Counselling for Students

From T2W1, to provide an additional avenue for our students to seek advice, help and/or support, our School Counsellor and Teacher Counsellors will be offering walk-in counselling on Tuesdays and Thursdays, during recess, for students who might need some advice or support for their social and emotional well-being.

If a student would like to speak with a counsellor, he/she is welcome to approach one of our Teacher Counsellors or School Counsellor (at the designated counselling rooms) for a walk-in session during recess. The student may do so after taking his/her meal or bring along some packed food to the session.

If our counsellors are engaged with other students, the student may fill up a request slip (at the entrance of one of the designated counselling rooms) and drop it into the registration box (at the same entrance). Our counsellors will follow-up by arranging for a meeting with him/her at the next available slot.
