2.	Overview of Programme for Orientation Week				
	To welcome students back to school in Term 1, Week 1, our <i>Ignite & Shine</i> orientation programme was planned and conducted for all students from Tuesday, 2 January 2024 (for P1) and Wednesday, 3 January 2024 (for P2 to P6) till Friday, 5 January 2024.				
	 The objectives of the orientation programme are as follows: To build a culture of discipline among students through co-creation of class rules and routines. To nurture a sense of belonging to the class/school and an inclusive learning environment. To set goals for the year with the incorporation of a Growth Mindset. While we have concluded the <i>Ignite & Shine</i> orientation programme, the teachers will continue to help your child with the transition back to school in the coming weeks. 				
3.	SMS Notification on Students' Absence Pending Reason				
	From Term 1, Week 3 (15 January 2024), parents who have identified/registered yourselves as the Primary Contacts for your child will receive a SMS notification <u>at 8.30am</u> IF your child has been marked " Absent Pending Reason " by his/her Form Teacher as they take the class attendance at the start of the school day. Please note that this will NOT apply to students marked " Absent " <u>with reason(s)</u> " provided by parents or caregivers, which the Form Teachers will follow-up with the child when he/she returns to school.				
	Parents are strongly encouraged to notify the Form Teacher(s) on the reason(s) via the established modes of communication should your child is not attending school.				
	NB: Parents can update the Primary Contact for your child via the Parents Gateway (PG) application.				
4.	Revised Arrangement for Students Waiting for their Siblings during School Dismissal				
	Students who wait for their siblings in school to leave together during school dismissal have been briefed in T1W1 and will wait for their siblings in the school canteen (at the benches in front of the school bookshop) during dismissal henceforth. This revised arrangement aims to provide a more conducive environment for the younger siblings, who are usually dismissed earlier, to wait comfortably for their elder brothers/sisters, especially during inclement weather, in the canteen. It will also help to decongest the pathways to Gate 2 during school dismissal.				
5.	1 st Emergency Evacuation Exercise				
	The school will be conducting an emergency evacuation exercise in Term 1, Week 3. This is part of our emergency preparedness plan to familiarise both staff and students on the proper safety procedures in an event of a real emergency. The students have also been briefed in school on Monday, 8 January about the exercise.				
6.	P3 to P6 Parents: School Dismissal via Gate 2				
	Due to the wet weather, the waiting areas just outside Gate 2 are especially crowded on rainy days during school dismissal. We would like to appeal for P3 to P6 parents' support to arrange for a further meeting point (e.g. at specific corner of void decks of nearby blocks) with your children during dismissal (if they are not going home on their own) so you need not have to wait right outside Gate 2 which can get really crowded and be in the way of the students who are passing through. Students who could not find their parents would be allowed to return to the school to wait behind Gate 2 for their parents too.

	E-vaporisers are illegal in Singapore. Under the Tobacco (Control of Advertisements and Sale) Act, the possession, use or purchase of e-vaporisers carries a maximum fine of \$2,000. It is also an offence to import, distribute, sell or offer for sale e-vaporisers and their components.

Schools will continue to educate our students about the dangers of vaping and the associated health risks.
