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5. Early Dismissal and Chinese New Year (CNY) Celebrations on 28 January 2025 (Tuesday)

This year, the Chinese New Year (CNY) holidays fall on 29 and 30 January 2025 (Wednesday and Thursday). School will resume on 31 January 2025 (Friday).

The school will be having our CNY celebrations and concert on the eve of CNY, 28 January 2025 (Wednesday). Students are to report to school by 7.30am on that day. At the end of the celebrations, students would be dismissed according to the timings shown below:

To foster a better understanding and an appreciation of the diverse cultures within the school community, students will be engaged in craftwork centred around the Chinese culture on that day. As such, lessons will be suspended, students are reminded to bring along their snack for their snack break at 8.15am as the canteen will not be operating on that day. Students are also required to bring along a storybook for silent reading. The CNY concert will commence right after the class activities at 8.45am.

On the day of the celebration, students are encouraged to come in Chinese traditional clothes paired with white socks and black school shoes to immerse themselves in the festive mood or don their regular school uniform/attire.

To spread the festive cheer, we invite parents and students to share Lunar New Year wishes and blessings creatively through a short video clip. You can record a video featuring you and/or your children sharing a message of joy, a cherished Lunar New Year tradition, or heartfelt wishes for your teachers and classmates. 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8. Personal Data Protection Act

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9. P1 Parents: Consent to use MOE's Centrally Provisioned Digital Tools

The school would like to seek all P1 parents' assistance in giving parental consent before provisioning your child with MOE's centrally provisioned digital tools, namely, Student iCON (Google Workplace) and Microsoft Pro Plus (Office tools such as Word, Excel and PowerPoint).

These digital tools complement students' learning in way of providing them with appropriate tools for collaboration, and to improve productivity and communication. Kindly refer to the announcement, "Consent to use MOE's Centrally Provisioned Digital Tools" in Parents Gateway (PG) and respond by 10 January 2025 (Friday). Thank you.

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10. School Emergency Preparedness Exercises

As part of our commitment to ensuring the safety and well-being of all students and staff, we will be conducting two essential emergency preparedness exercises during Term 1: **Emergency Evacuation Exercise** and **Lockdown Exercise**. These drills are critical in helping us enhance our readiness for real-life emergencies.

The exercises are designed to familiarize both students and staff with the appropriate responses to different emergency situations, ensuring that everyone knows how to act quickly and safely. Participation in these drills will help reinforce the importance of safety protocols and allow us to identify any areas for improvement in our emergency procedures.

We appreciate your support in helping us maintain a safe and secure learning environment for all.

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11. Safety, Health and Emergency Matters

Temperature Taking Exercise

A Temperature Taking Exercise will be conducted for all students and staff on **15 January 2025** (Wednesday). It aims to:

- 1. maintain schools' preparedness to re-activate the temperature-taking regime should the need arises; and
- 2. educate students on taking personal responsibility for their own health and social responsibility.
- 3. Please remind your child to bring along a working thermometer for the exercise.

All P1 students were given a complimentary Oral Digital Thermometer (ODT).

School Safety and Security

The school has put in place several procedures to ensure school security and the safety of our children.

Please note that parents are allowed to enter school premises only if you:

- need to fetch your child/children home early (before dismissal time);
- have an appointment with a school staff; or
- need to make an enquiry at the General Office.

All visitors, including parents, must report to the Security Guard Post at the Main Gate to obtain a visitor's pass before proceeding to the General Office. Parents are not allowed to enter the school through the side gates without obtaining a visitor's pass from the Security Guard Post.

In the event your child is not well while in school, the school will contact you to make arrangements to fetch him/her home. For safety reasons, the school will not release the child to return home on his/her own. If parents are unable to come, then a trusted adult (e.g. a domestic helper or relative) will need to come by to bring the child home.

To <u>inculcate in our students the value of responsibility and independence</u>, they will be expected to remember to bring the books and items that they need and not rely on their parents to deliver their personal items.

Students need to learn to be resilient and face up to consequences for forgetting to bring what is required for use in school. Students who have forgotten to bring their pocket money may approach our staff in the General Office if they need to borrow some money.

Students are also strongly discouraged from bringing to school expensive personal belongings such as branded stationery, electronic gadgets, mobile phones, etc.

Parents Taking Children Out of School during Term Time / Curricular Hours

During the course of the year, parents are urged not to take your child/children out of school during school days or curricular hours for private matters such as attendance of weddings. Taking your child/children out of school during term time or curricular hours disrupts learning and may result in your child/children having difficulty following up with lesson proper when he/she/they return(s) to school. Your cooperation in this matter is deeply appreciated.

Students Returning from Medical Leave

Students returning to school after their medical leave must submit their medical certificates (MC) to their Form Teachers immediately. The MC must indicate the duration within which they are to refrain from participating in physical activities, if relevant. Parents should remind the doctors to indicate this information in the MC for PE teachers' follow-up.

Let's Do Our Part to Keep Everyone Safe and Healthy

We seek parents' support to keep the school a safe environment for all our students.

If your child is unwell, please ensure that he/she stays at home and seek medical attention. If your child is recovering from respiratory-related illnesses, please encourage him/her to exercise social responsibility by wearing a mask and minimise social interaction.

Let us all do our part to exercise personal and social responsibility for the well-being of our students and staff.

Traffic Advisory: Road Safety of Students

For Parents who are driving, do note the following:

Drop-off During Morning Peak Hours and Pick-up During School Dismissal

- Drop-off in the morning: between 6.45am and 7.30am.
- Pick-up during school dismissal: only after the school buses have moved off (at about 1.50pm). Timings apply for wet and dry weather.

Our students' safety is our priority. We would like to seek your cooperation and support to work with the school in ensuring the safety of our students coming to school, within the school compound and leaving the school.

We strongly discourage parents from stopping your vehicles along Fernvale Link to drop your child/children off or parking your vehicle by the roadside while waiting for your child/children. This is to facilitate smooth traffic flow along Fernvale Link. Do plan your trip to the school so that you do not end up stopping your vehicles and waiting along Fernvale Link. Parents should note that Traffic Enforcement Officers from Land Transport Authority (LTA) may be stationed along Fernvale Link from time to time. As such, errant drivers may be booked.

Due to security considerations, we do not allow parents to park your vehicles in school while waiting for your child/children. Should you be waiting for your child/children at the nearby carparks during dismissal, please be considerate to fellow road users.

For the safety of your child/children, our students and fellow road users, we strongly urge you to adhere to the traffic regulations and rules.
