

Make mathematics meaningful.

Get your child to see how mathematics is relevant in their daily life.



daily life?





- Get your child to understand the problem and how to make sense of the problem
- Get your child to show you the whole process of solving the problem, not
 just the solutions, e.g. explain the steps and sequence
- Guide your child to look at alternative methods and then choose the most appropriate method
- Allow your child to reason his / her thinking
- Show all workings clearly and label the number equations
- Teach your child how to check his / her answers





Frequently Asked Question

Is model drawing necessary since word problems in Primary 2 are easy? Are marks awarded for drawing model?

While marks are not awarded for models drawn, it is a useful heuristics to help students understand and solve mathematical problems. Students are highly encouraged to draw models to help them analyse, scaffold and solve the problems.

The questions in Primary 2 are used to teach students basic model drawing skills and they will need to draw more complex models when they move to a higher level.








Reading allows us to go on an adventure without leaving our seats. We could meet new friends and heroes along the way.

Offering HMTL



Objective: To further strengthen the learning of MTL from an early age, primary schools can offer HMTL across the 3 official MTLs from P3 onwards starting 2022.

For P3 entry:

The school will use a set of qualitative descriptors (QDs) based on the P2 Mother Tongue Languages Learning Outcomes to determine students' MTL proficiency. Students offering HMTL at P3 should be proficient in their oracy skills and demonstrate strong foundation for literary skills.

Evidence of students' performance throughout the year

Gathered information about students' learning through checkpoints such as on-going assessments or alternative assessments to further provide information on students' learning progress and inclination.

Teachers' feedback and observations

To cover a whole range of performance, additional information about student's learning can be gathered from class discussions, class work and homework.

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Process of Offering HMTL



Selection takes place in Term 4.

Parents of selected students will be invited to attend a briefing.

Parents opt in or opt out.









